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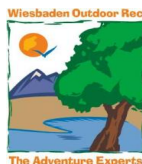

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Engelberg Ski & Winter Resort Switzerland

Engelberg isn't just a winter ski resort, it's a winter haven. It has so much on offer that you might be tempted to extend your stay just to pack it all in.

Understandably, skiing is the number one pastime in Engelberg with much of the terrain designed for advanced skiers with beginners needing to be wary of the more challenging pistes. The season typically lasts from October until May and the area has also become an off-piste skiing Mecca with many winter visitors travelling to enjoy the challenging descents that can be reached from the lift ski areas of Jochpass and Titlis. Snowboarding is well provided for and there are plenty of parks to test your skills.

That's not to say there's nothing for beginners to enjoy, however – for example, the area of Brunni is suitable for early intermediates, although its snow season is not typically as long. The Lake Lucerne region offers a relaxing diversion from the typical winter activities such as skiing, snowboarding and sledding with a wide selections of shops, cafés and restaurants to enjoy. Lucerne is easily reached from Engelberg by the hourly Swiss Rail service.

Cross country skiing can be enjoyed with a variety of different routes with interesting courses in the Engelberg valley. Alternatively, you can take in the scenery with some winter hiking that includes routes through the woods with impressive views of the mountains and glaciers.

For something of a walk on the wild side, check out the sledding options available with several runs to choose from where you can slide through the snow. You can also listen to the snow crunch under your feet by taking one of the snow shoeing routes; or you could enjoy the ultimate thrill ride at the SnowXPark, riding electric motorbikes converted for use on snow.

Feldberg resort in the Black Forest is great for families and beginners. There are 50 km of pistes winding through the Black Forest Mountains. There are a range of runs at Feldberg including blacks with the longest at 3km. There is also a snow park. The 26 km of skiing at Feldberg is provided throughout the nearby villages. The ski pass covers the whole area. Off the slopes this Black Forest resort has enough bars and restaurants to keep everyone fed and watered. Skiing is at relatively low altitude, so snow cover can be variable. Feldberg is able to augment natural snow, with 33 Snow Cannons.

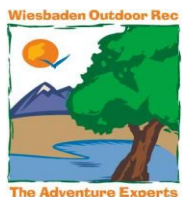

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Saas Fee, Switzerland

Beautiful, car-free village with snowsure slopes on top of the world. Saas-Fee, “the pearl of the Alps”, is untouched by the worst of the modern world, though it’s not short of powerful lifts to take you to the tops – and in these mountains that means a breath taking 3500 metres above sea level.. It oozes Swiss charm and the setting is stunning - spectacular glaciers and 4000m peaks surround the place. Good snow is guaranteed, even late in the season. The altitude that you will spend most of our time at is between 2500m and 3500m. This is unrivaled in the Alps.

High and snow-sure, the internationally renowned village of Saas-Fee, nestles at 1800m, just 15km north-east of Zermatt, without its crowds but with more original alpine charm. The village is old, quaint, and traffic-free other than for a few service vehicles. The mountains surrounding Saas-Fee are in-your-face monsters, towering above the village, their huge glaciers spilling down towards the valley. The immediacy of the scenery makes this a great place for committed mountain lovers: even on a blue sky day the brooding heights are more striking than pretty.

Saas-Fee is recognised as one of Switzerland’s more family friendly ski resorts with lots of flat sunny slopes for beginners and plenty of supervised activities for children. Saas-Fee’s piste skiing is quite extensive and snow conditions are usually first class. For off-piste skiing in Saas-Fee there are endless routes to explore, many of them starting from peaks which must first be climbed. If you want to notch up ascents of 4,000m peaks, followed by ski descents of half that figure, Saas-Fee is the place to do it.

The Allalin glacier, at the top of the resort, is no scrap of ice. Even though, like every Alpine glacier, it's on the retreat, it's still an impressive piece of work, and dominates the slopes above the town.

Most importantly, its presence guarantees skiing throughout the year. Needless to say, during the regular winter season, the snow on its surface is almost always good. The 1700m on-piste descent you can stitch together, from the 3500m Allalin funicular station, passing by the Morenia mid-station, all the way back down into town is real scorcher.

Freestylers. *There's a big terrain park up on the glacier, (which includes half-pipe, lots of kickers and rails and a boardercross course). Snow-parks.com rates it highly, at 4.5/5. The resort's home of one of the classic slacker hang-outs too: “Popcorn.” which starts as a café, carries on as a bar, and finishes at about 4 am as a full-on, wigged-out club*

Families. *The traffic-free town is cute and easy-going, the hotels at the southern end of town look out straight onto the nursery slopes, and there's a wealth of other activities to keep the nippers happy if they don't want to ski.*

Beginners. *Not only are the nursery slopes set apart from the main pistes (so no heart-stopping moments when the speed freaks whizz by), but there are easy-going slopes at two stages higher up to which you can progress - though you'll have to ride the lifts back down at the end of your session.*

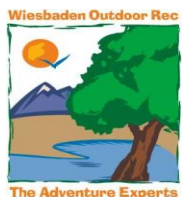

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Bad Hofgastein, Austria

The Austrian ski resort of **Bad Hofgastein** is part of the Gastein Ski Area with access to 178 individual pistes. In addition to the skiing in Bad Hofgastein itself (175km of pisted ski runs), the appropriate ski Lift Pass will allow you to ski or snowboard in the other Gastein ski resorts of Bad Gastein, Dorfgastein, Graukogel and Sportgastein. With skiing above 2000 metres, snow cover is generally reliable.

Skiing in Bad Hofgastein

The Gastein ski area, one of Austria's largest, is separated in to five ski areas, rising up to 2,700 meters in altitude, served by three resorts and several small additional lift base areas. With over 200 prepared pistes between them, this is one of the longest and highest Austrian ski areas with a big choice for everyone from beginners to experts.

The ski area directly above Bad Hofgastein is based on the Schlossalm which is more-or-less lift-linked to Bad Gastein, the biggest settlement in the valley, via the small Angertal Ski centre. This takes you to the largest of the ski areas on the Stubnerkogel mountain above Bad Gastein.

Beginners are likely to start off on the Angertal area, reached by ski bus from the resort.

A second lower area, reached by train or bus down the valley, links Grossarl (in the next valley) to Dorfgastein at the bottom of the Gastein Valley and a short ski busride down the valley. The ski link is over the Kreuzkogel Mountain (2027m). The third and highest ski area is the small sector above Sport Gastein which has a base at 1600 metres and a snow-sure top lift at 2685m on the Kreuzkogel mountain. The off-piste powder trails down from here are particularly highly regarded.

So you may choose between the ski circuit connections of Stubnerkogel-Angertal-Schlossalm and Dorfgastein-Großarl, the world championship area of the Graukogel and the high alpine Sportgastein. The high altitude terrain and extensive snow making cover mean poor snow cover is rarely a problem here.

More advanced skiers will probably tend towards the blacks on the Stubnerkogel

Snowboarding in Bad Hofgastein

In this large area, which has hosted world Cup boarding events, there are plenty of deep powder pistes (hopefully) for freeriders to enjoy. For freestylers the Funpark Boarder's Paradise on the Dorfgastein - Grossarl link is located on the Grossarl-side, near to piste number 9.
